

Rowland Hall Scholarship Award Information

Rowland Hall offers a variety of scholarship and financial aid awards. The following are the named scholarships; many scholarships are currently available to qualified students and several scholarships are in the process of being funded to appropriate levels before awards will be offered. Scholarship awards eligibility varies according to academic ability, other talents or qualities desired and specified by the scholarship, grade of entry, and other factors.

Adam Bradford Scholarship

Established in recognition of Adam Bradford who was a student at Rowland Hall Lower School from 1985 to 1991. It is a one-year scholarship awarded to a third or fourth grade student who is considered an asset to the school either through talent, citizenship, or other general contributions.

Aunt Henry/Fanny Jones Scholarship

Established to honor Fanny Jones, a beloved and influential teacher at Rowland Hall, when it was a girls' boarding school. It is a one-year scholarship awarded to a student who shows academic promise and excellent citizenship.

David Edward Cumming Scholarship

Established by former Rowland Hall student, David Cumming, as a three-year scholarship to be awarded to a high school student representing diversity and considered to be an asset through talents, citizenship or other general contributions.

Faculty Sponsored Scholarship

Established in honor of retiring kindergarten teacher Shawnie Moore in 1999, and funded by faculty donations over a 10-years period. It is a one-year scholarship awarded to a first, second, or third grade student considered an asset to the school either through talents, citizenship, or other general contributions.

Reverend France Davis Scholarship

Established by the school to honor and acknowledges the contributions of Reverend France Davis to Salt Lake City and the state of Utah, particularly in the areas of civil rights and diversity; as well as his role in community-building at the Calvary Baptist Church where he has been pastor for over 30 years. This scholarship is awarded on the basis of academic merit and citizenship and other factors) to a limited number of entering students, K-5, who will be supported by the scholarship through 12th grade graduation. Gibbons Scholarship

Established by the Gibbons Family, who are all alumni of the school, as a one-year award for a promising high school student.

Ian Cumming Scholarship

Established by Rowland Hall Emeritus Trustee and long-time, generous supporter, Ian Cumming, as an annually renewable scholarship to be awarded to a promising freshman or sophomore.

John and Marcia Price Family Scholarship

Established in 2007 by The John and Marcia Price Family Foundation to support the school's desire to continue to build a rich culture of diversity among it's student body, and awarded to a student who is an asset to the school through either talents, citizenship, other contributions, and diversity.

Lynne Marianni Zimmerman Scholarship

Created to honor the memory of a cherished parent and member of the school community as a three-year award for a qualified sixth grade girl who shows academic promise and good citizenship.

The Masonic Scholarship

Established by the Masons of Salt Lake City a a one-year scholarship to an Upper School (9-12) students who is considered an asset to the school either through talents, citizenship, or other general contributions.

The Palazzi/Day Scholarship

Established in 1977 by Suzanne Palazzi Day, former Rowland Hall trustee, and Sarah Day, Rowland Hall alumnae, as a one-year scholarship for an Upper School (9-12) girl considered an asset to the school either through talents, citizenship, or other general contributions.

Rose Diesley Memorial Scholarship

Established by the Diesley Family in memory of their daughter Rose, a bright and lovely young Rowland Hall student, as a one-year scholarship to a first grader who is an asset to the school either through talents, citizenship, or other general contributions.

The Swanson Foundation Scholarship

Established by alumnus, former parent, and former trustee Charles Swanson, as a one-year award to a Rowland Hall student considered and asset to the school either through talents, citizenship, or other general contributions.

Patricia C. Brim Memorial Scholarship

Established to honor Pat Brim, alumnae of 1941 and a talented classical pianist with a passion for literature, art, and music, to award to an Upper School (9-12) girl with a record of academic excellence.
